# BACK THE BARNS

Behind a grand champion prize given at the lowa State Fair is an adolescent, learning and showcasing their hard work inside a livestock barn. These youth grow into the next generation of lowans that make our state so special.

Please consider joining the Blue Ribbon Foundation's "Back the Barns" campaign. Your support of the barn restoration project will guarantee the tradition of showing livestock at the lowa State Fair continues to thrive in amazing facilities.

Starting this spring with the sheep barn and continuing over the next several years, the cattle, horse and swine barns will each be part of the \$25 million renovation. Each structure will have dedicated restorations in areas that are vitally needed such as roofing, flooring, electrical, restrooms and tuckpointing to name a few.

The sheep barn renovation will focus on restoring the building's masonry, including the unique terra cotta trim and east entrance murals with floral arches and ram's head column capitals. The sheep barn's restrooms will be upgraded to be handicap accessible, offices remodeled and roof repairs where needed. There will also be specific network and Wi-Fi improvements.

Members of the Blue Ribbon Foundation's Back the Barns campaign are those generous donors who have pledged \$1,000 per year for 3 years in support of the lowa State Fair's historic livestock barn restoration project.

As a thank you for joining the Back the Barns campaign, you will receive a commemorative belt buckle. These belt buckles don't just represent the rich agriculture heritage of lowa but are a symbol of your generosity in supporting the next generation of 4-H and FFA youth that will lead our state. If your design wins, the T-shirt will be for sale in the official Iowa State Fair Store. Funds from the sale of the T-shirt will support our mission of improving the historic Fairgrounds.

To enter, send us your T-shirt design by May 1. A selection committee will choose the top five designs. Those designs will be posted on the Iowa State Fair Blue Ribbon Foundation's website and Facebook page with voting via Facebook "like" or online via our website. Voting will be open from May 8-15. The winner will be announced on May 16. The top three votegetters will receive Iowa State Fair prize packages.

#### **Entry and Design Guidelines:**

- Entries can be submitted to Info@BlueRibbonFoundation.org or by mail to Iowa State Fair Blue Ribbon Foundation, PO Box 57130, Des Moines, IA 50317. The entry deadline is May 1, 2023.
- The design must contain the words "Iowa State Fair" and represent an aspect of the Iowa State Fair, its facilities or traditions.
- The entry should be accompanied by your name and contact information including mailing address, phone number and email.
  - The design may be drawn, printed or digital. Electronic submissions are preferred and files must be saved to 300 dpi and be high resolution in either .AI, JPG, .PDF, .PNG or .PSD format. Please convert all text to outline. If your design is selected, you will be required to provide the original design in a high-resolution format that is compatible with Photoshop, Illustrator or other professional design program.
- Design dimensions should not exceed 14" x 17".
- The color of the final shirt will be determined by the Foundation.
- Design must be able to be screen printed. A maximum of five ink colors. Preference given to fewer colors.
- Designs will be judged on the following:
  - Concept/originality
  - Striking and memorable
  - Visibility eye-catching and visible from a reasonable distance
  - Complete must be ready for print
  - Feasibility must be easy to reproduce on a T-shirt
- Please note that the Foundation reserves the right to adjust the winning design.

#### **Contest Rules:**

- All entries must be original creations that have never been published and do not contain any profanity, trademarks, logos, restricted or copyrighted works of any other person or business.
- The winning design will remain the property of the Iowa State Fair Blue Ribbon Foundation and will not be returned to you nor will you receive any compensation for said design other than the aforementioned prize package. The Foundation may use the winning design at any time after the contest. The winning contestant may display their design in a portfolio or personal collection, but may not sell or reproduce the design for any other purpose once submitted to the contest.
- By submitting an entry and including your name, address and contact information, you are acknowledging your acceptance and understanding of the complete contest rules including that the winning design is the property of the Iowa State Fair Blue Ribbon Foundation.

- More than one entry can be submitted by an individual but they must be submitted as separate entries.
- A panel of judges selected by the Blue Ribbon Foundation will choose the top submissions which will be put to a public vote.
  - Voting begins on Monday, May 8 and closes on Monday, May 15, 2023. Finalists' designs will be posted on the Iowa State Fair Blue Ribbon Foundation's website and Facebook page. Voting can be via Facebook "like" or website.
  - The winner will be notified by email at the close of the voting period.
- The Foundation reserves the right to end this contest at any time, effective on the date of the termination notice and is under no obligation to give advance notice of the termination.

- This contest is subject to all federal, state and local laws.
- Current Iowa State Fair or Iowa State Fair Blue Ribbon Foundation full-time staff, board members or their immediate family members are not allowed to participate.
- At the sole discretion of the Foundation, disqualification, forfeiture and the selection of an alternate winner may result from any of the following:
  - Winner's failure to respond to notification within seven (7) business days after its transmission;
  - The return of an email notification as undeliverable after three (3) attempts;
  - Winner's failure to provide original design files; failure to submit a completely original design; or failure to execute and return a release form.

## PROJECT Projes:

**Elwell Family Park:** The 3rd stage of the multi-phase project includes adding permanent restroom facilities to the Elwell Family Park. These restrooms will be a convenient upgrade for Fairgoers watching the annual truck & tractor pulls and a variety of other events including monster trucks, demolition derby, and motorsport races with even more possibilities in the future.

**Public Safety Building:** The lowa State Fair will update our public safety building to make sure the facility matches the high standards of the lowa State Fair Police Department. The first phase will include a new two-story addition to the east side of the building completed for the 2023 lowa State Fair. The second phase will include renovation of the existing space, scheduled to be completed in 2024. The Blue Ribbon Foundation worked with Governor Kim Reynolds to receive federal funding made available to the State of Iowa for this project.

Fairview Tap: Fairgoers enjoy sipping on a wide selection of beers and wine while relaxing on top of the hill near Grandfather's Barn at the Fairview Tap. Showcasing special events like trivia and music, the space also hosted a "Pop Up Happy Hour" event during the Fair. The venue will receive upgrades including patio expansion this spring. This addition will provide more outside seating to take full advantage of the available space and the amazing view.

**Pioneer Hall:** Pioneer Hall continually receives maintenance and after 10 years of small updates, the exterior of the building is near completion. Crews have finished repairing each side of the building and will finish the project by rebuilding the main doors. As the oldest landmark on the historic Fairgrounds, the care and attention to this facility is unmatched. It's truly our history.

Updating something as simple as doors is not only necessary but will continue to make the Iowa State Fairgrounds an admired historical venue in the state of Iowa. The Iowa State Fair is a tradition any Iowan can be proud of, and the Blue Ribbon Foundation is dedicated to continuing that legacy.

he Blue Ribbon Foundation continues to undertake important improvements on the historical Iowa State Fairgrounds that are enjoyed by Iowans during August and throughout the year. We rely
