Our Foundation volunteers love to volunteer! The vast majority of those who give their time in August return year after year. Several have even been with us since 1993. Many have volunteered annually for a decade or more, and enthusiastic new Fair-lovers join us every year.

With restrooms added at Elwell Family Park, a two-story addition to the Public Safety Building, an expanded patio at the Fairview Tap and the exterior completed at Pioneer Hall – the Fairgrounds will be ready to welcome visitors in August.

Existing restrooms were upgraded to be handicap accessible, offices were remodeled and roof repairs made where needed. New underground storm sewer piping was installed and there will be specific network and Wi-Fi enhancements.

DONOR PROFILE: TIM MALLICOAT & SONNY HALL



ot and sticky temperatures are normal for August in Iowa. Most Iowans welcome the occasional cool down that a summer rainstorm can bring. As long as it isn't during the best 11 days of the month.

When heavy rains soaked the Iowa State Fairgrounds this past August, the grassy areas of the grounds became a muddy mess. This included the southwest corner of the Fairgrounds which is continuing to develop with new attractions and a goal of becoming an even more popular area with food, drink and entertainment.

This greenspace west of the Richard O. Jacobson Exhibition Center is now home to the Iowa Craft Beer Tent. It was as popular as ever with the expanded footprint and new permanent structure. However, the beloved beer venue was not exempt from the effects of Mother Nature's downpour.

Rain wasn't going to ruin Tim Mallicoat's day at the Iowa State Fair. While enjoying his cold beverage, standing in the mud, he thought of a way to improve the space while supporting the Iowa State Fair. "After seeing the mess the rain created at the Iowa Craft Beer Tent last year," said Tim, "I knew there was something that could be done to fix the problem. No matter rain or shine – the space could continue to be enjoyed."

Tim is the President and CEO of the Rasmussen Group, a Des Moines-based business that represents various multi-faceted construction companies. Mallicoat oversees the daily operations of the entire group of companies.

As members of the Iowa Concrete Paving Association, Tim became familiar with colleague Sonny Hall, CEO of Absolute Group, another Iowa company that provides a broad range of municipal, commercial and residential construction solutions.

The two business leaders agreed to work together to provide a much needed fix to the mud problem. Sonny graciously gave a \$130,000 in-kind donation of supplies and labor to fund the plans. The best part about this project was using it as a learning opportunity, the core of the Iowa State Fair's mission.

This past April, more than 5,000 high school students from across the state gathered on the Iowa State Fairgrounds for a hands-on learning experience through the Build My Future event. As concrete was poured at Iowa Craft Beer Tent, students could learn the process from start to finish, ask questions and explore the opportunity of working in the construction industry.

"I have always loved attending the Iowa State Fair," Sonny said. "It's wonderful seeing the Iowa pride everyone shares when gathering on the Fairgrounds. I want to see that continue for years to come and I know that by supporting the Blue Ribbon Foundation, future generations will enjoy the same traditions we do now."

Thanks to Tim Mallicoat with Rasmussen Group and Sonny Hall with Absolute Group, the Iowa Craft Beer Tent has said goodbye to mulch, dirt, and mud and hello

to a beautiful paved floor. We cannot thank them enough for their dedicated support of the Blue Ribbon Foundation and the Iowa State Fair.
