# DONATION

The Blue Ribbon Foundation prides itself on being thoughtful and responsible with every dollar donated to our mission. There have been several new contributions that will continue to improve the historic Iowa State Fairarounds.

**Prairie Meadows:** Thank you to Prairie Meadows for the \$50,000 grant to update the ramp at the Agriculture Building. The ramp that provides the primary entry to the second story has an original base made of poured concrete that creates a bridge over an alleyway. A wooden ramp was built on top of the concrete to make this entrance handicap accessible.

The 63-foot ramp was constructed of pressure treated wood and painted. Over the years, the paint has peeled and the wood splintered and rotted with use and weathering, creating areas that sag and are unstable making it difficult and somewhat hazardous for pedestrians. We are excited for the ramp to be upgraded so Fairgoers can safely access the second floor.

Gray Family Way: Thank you to the Steve and Sally Gray family for their donation of \$100,000 for the Livestock Barn renovation project. The Sheep Barn has received new restrooms, offices, roofing, underground storm sewer and more. Work will continue on the Horse, Swine and Cattle barns over the next couple years.

Their gift also will provide new wayfinding signage west of the Livestock Pavilion, guiding Fairgoers to Alliant Energy Landing and other landmarks in the area.

Jacobson Square: The Richard O. Jacobson Foundation is assisting in the development of the area north of the Oman Family Youth Inn. Jacobson Square will be a small camping lot the Blue Ribbon Foundation will be able to auction off during the Corndog Kickoff. This donation also lays the groundwork for additional improvements to this area of the Fairgrounds in the future.

Endowment Gift: Thank you to Patty and Jim Cownie for their generous contribution to the Blue Ribbon Foundation's endowment. They donated \$500,000 to create a special fund which will underwrite the cost of our internship program. Each year interns join the full-time staff to help run fundraising events and programs. Our organization would not be successful without them. Each year the interns gain real-world experience while having fun. With the Cownie's support, our internship program will continue long into the future.

# SAVING FAIRGROUNDS rees



ore than 450 acres make up the Iowa State Fairgrounds. Throughout this area there are approximately 3,242 trees. The shade and natural beauty the trees provide are a valuable and appreciated element of the

historic landscape.

It is estimated that the oldest trees were planted in the late 1880s on the original farm prior to the site being designated as the Iowa State Fairgrounds in 1886. In 1887, the Fair Board commissioned the planting of 1,500 trees at a cost of \$330 (that's 22 cents per tree!).

Trees require regular evaluation and tender loving care just like our many buildings, barns and other important infrastructure.

After the 2023 Iowa State Fair, Mary and Dale Andringa shared their concern for several trees on the Fairgrounds. Some appeared to be struggling. With their support, it was a perfect opportunity to have all the trees on the Fairgrounds evaluated.

The Blue Ribbon Foundation partnered with Pella Tree Service to evaluate the many species growing within the main Fairgrounds. Now, thanks to a generous donation provided by the Andringas, there is a plan to treat and support the trees that are in greatest need. The species being treated include spruce, crabapple, evergreen, ash, birch, bur oak and maple.
