Entry and Design Guidelines:

- Entries can be submitted to Info@BlueRibbonFoundation.org or by mail to Iowa State Fair Blue Ribbon Foundation, PO Box 57130, Des Moines, IA 50317. The entry deadline is May 1, 2024.
- The design must contain the words "Iowa State Fair" and represent an aspect of the Iowa State Fair, its facilities or traditions.
- The entry should be accompanied by your name and contact information including mailing address, phone number and email.
- The design may be drawn, printed or digital. Electronic submissions are preferred and files must be saved to 300 dpi and be high resolution in either .AI, .JPG, .PDF, .PNG or .PSD format. Please convert all text to outline. If your design is selected, you will be required to provide the original design in a high-resolution format that is compatible with Photoshop, Illustrator or other professional design program.
- Design dimensions should not exceed 14" x 17".
- The color of the final shirt will be determined by the Foundation.
- Design must be able to be screen printed. A maximum of five ink colors. Preference given to fewer colors.
- Designs will be judged on the following:
 - Concept/originality
 - Striking and memorable
 - Visibility eye-catching and visible from a reasonable distance
 - Complete must be ready for print
 - Feasibility must be easy to reproduce on a T-shirt
- Please note that the Foundation reserves the right to adjust the winning design.

Contest Rules:

- All entries must be original creations that have never been published and do not contain any profanity, trademarks, logos, restricted or copyrighted works of any other person or business.
- The winning design will remain the property of the Iowa State Fair Blue Ribbon Foundation and will not be returned to you nor will you receive any compensation for said design other than the aforementioned prize package. The Foundation may use the winning design at any time after the contest. The winning contestant may display their design in a portfolio or personal collection, but may not sell or reproduce the design for any other purpose once submitted to the contest.
- By submitting an entry and including your name, address and contact information, you are acknowledging your acceptance and understanding of the complete contest rules including that the winning design is the property of the Iowa State Fair Blue Ribbon Foundation.

- More than one entry can be submitted by an individual but they must be submitted as separate entries.
- A panel of judges selected by the Blue Ribbon Foundation will choose the top submissions which will be put to a public vote.
 - Voting begins on Wednesday, May 8 and closes on Tuesday, May 14, 2024. Finalists' designs will be posted on the Iowa State Fair Blue Ribbon Foundation's website and Facebook page. Voting can be via Facebook "like" or website.
 - The winner will be notified by email at the close of the voting period.
- The Foundation reserves the right to end this contest at any time, effective on the date of the termination notice and is under no obligation to give advance notice of the termination.

- This contest is subject to all federal, state and local laws.
- Current Iowa State Fair or Iowa State Fair Blue Ribbon Foundation full-time staff, board members or their immediate family members are not allowed to participate.
- At the sole discretion of the Foundation, disqualification, forfeiture and the selection of an alternate winner may result from any of the following:
 - Winner's failure to respond to notification within seven (7) business days after its transmission;
 - The return of an email notification as undeliverable after three (3) attempts;
 - Winner's failure to provide original design files; failure to submit a completely original design; or failure to execute and return a release form.

Corndog Kickoff: Volunteers are needed for the Corndog Kickoff on Saturday, July 13. The volunteer shifts run approximately four hours in length and include ticket taking, serving food and beverages, merchandise sales, data entry, check-out, etc. Past volunteers will be contacted by email in early May.

Spring Grounds Cleanup and Planting: This is your chance to learn from the Iowa State Fair horticulturists and expand your gardening skills. We need volunteers in April to help weed and prep flower beds. In mid-May, we need help planting flowers throughout the Fairgrounds.

Bench Rejuvenation: Many benches on the Fairgrounds have been updated with new composite material slats. Fair staff have already rejuvenated 300 benches and now need help redoing another 100 before August. If you are handy with a drill, please consider joining this team.

PROJECT UpJate

Fall, winter and now into spring, crews stay busy all year long tackling projects across the Iowa State Fairgrounds. Thank you to all our generous donors who have supported the Blue Ribbon Foundation's mission and are making many of these projects possible.

- Hillcrest Dorm received a new roof in the fall. Next year, an update to the ventilation system, windows and restrooms will be completed. FFA members who serve as Grandstand ushers reside in Hillcrest during the Fair.
- Paved handicap parking was added north of Gate 13.
- The Ye Old Mill received new sheathing, fascia and architectural shingles on the roof of the main building. All of the actual boats have been refurbished, along with the mechanical system that operates the ride. The next steps include painting the whole structure, reroofing the tunnel and adding a new rock landscape in the "middle" of the tunnel. Next year, additional interior improvements will be made.
- The Agriculture Building's south and west doors will be replaced, as well as the ramp on the east side of the building.
- The women's restroom by the Administration Building will be remodeled.
- Exterior painting on Pioneer Hall will be completed.
- New lighting in parking Lot C on the northeast side of the Fairgrounds will be added.
- Converting several drinking fountains into water bottle filling stations.
- Plans to add picnic tables and shade structures on the lawn west of the Richard O. Jacobson Exhibition Center.
- The Sheep Barn is in the 2nd phase of renovation scheduled to be completed by Fair time.

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DONOR PROFILE: MARTHA MILLER

aving the reputation for spurring growth in her hometown of Pleasant Hill, Martha Miller was someone that the Blue Ribbon Foundation's previous Executive Director wanted in our corner. Martha first met John Putney in 1993 when she was serving as the chairwoman of

the Des Moines Metropolitan Planning Organization.

John asked Martha if she would consider helping raise money to renovate the historic Iowa State Fair Grandstand. As a born and raised "East Sider," Martha jumped at the opportunity to get involved.

"The Iowa State Fair has something for everyone to enjoy," said Martha. "I wanted to be involved with the Blue Ribbon Foundation because I knew they were going to make the Fairgrounds even better by tackling the needed renovation projects."

Martha grew up in Pleasant Hill and has lived there all her life. As a young girl, she could walk to the Fairgrounds and instantly fell in love with the Iowa State Fair. One of her earliest memories is seeing the elephant "Baby Mine" come to the Fair. As she got older, she worked at her aunt's food stand and spent plenty of time at Teen Town.

After graduating from East High, Martha worked as a proofreader for Meredith Publishing Company. Once married, she worked for their family business – Miller the Driller. Continuing her childhood traditions, the entire Miller family would attend the Iowa State Fair each year.

Martha started volunteering for the Blue Ribbon Foundation in 1993 by selling bottles of water and merchandise. It was easy for her to help customers find the perfect souvenir because Martha loved the merchandise herself. The pottery is still her favorite item to collect and she proudly displays them in her home. She has each piece and plans to pass the collection down to her granddaughter one day. As the Blue Ribbon Foundation organization developed, Martha continued to help staff wherever she might be needed. If a project came up, Martha was quick to show support.
